House Floor Action



Possible Floor Vote

ESHB 1282: Requiring environmental and labor reporting for public building construction and renovation material.

 Creates a database to help the state leverage its purchasing power in order to reward manufacturers and producers of climate smart building materials that support workers.



Possible Floor Vote

HB 2250: Increasing representation and voter participation in local elections.

- Prevents electoral chaos by ensuring that RCV implementation is consistent across the state with best practices for RCV implementation based on decades of successful RCV elections across America.
- Helps towns and counties avoid costly lawsuits under the Washington Voting Rights Act by giving places an established avenue to upgrade to rankedchoice voting and improve local representation.
