#### HB 1409: Concerning the Clean Fuel Standard

- The Clean Fuel Standard cuts climate pollution from transportation - the largest source of greenhouse gases in Washington - through reducing the carbon intensity of transportation fuels and increasing the use of low-carbon fuels and electricity.
- HB 1409 makes the carbon intensity requirements steadier, providing for a more stable market.

#### HB 1420: Establishing producer responsibility for textiles.

- Sets up an extended producer responsibility program for apparel and textiles and restricts toxic PFAS chemicals in textile products.
- Modeled after recent law passed in California and emphasizes repair and reuse in addition to recycling, to help reduce the large textile waste problem.

**HB 1462: Reducing greenhouse gas emissions associated with hydrofluorocarbons.**

- Hydrofluorocarbon (HFC) refrigerants are a major source of climate pollution. In the US, about 80% of refrigerant gases are vented to the atmosphere at end of life.
  - HB 1462 would reduce greenhouse gas emissions associated with HFCs by transitioning to environmentally and economically sustainable alternatives and promoting use of reclaimed HFCs.

**HB 1483: Supporting the servicing and right to repair of certain products with digital electronics in a secure and reliable manner.**

- Requires digital electronic product manufacturers, to make repair information, parts and tools available to independent repair businesses and owners.
  - Reduces the amount of e-waste and makes it possible for small businesses to repair these items, bringing better access across the state and extending the life of computers, tablets and cellphones, and household appliances

**HB 1497: Improving outcomes associated with waste material management systems.**

- Addresses composting and other management of organic (yard and food waste) in order to divert the material from the landfill and avoid methane gas generation.
  - Includes enhanced education, standardized color-coded collection bins and lids, a pathway for bringing organics collection to more multi-family buildings, support for food waste reduction efforts in K-12 schools and more

**HB 1543: Increasing compliance pathways for the clean buildings performance standard.**

- Improves the clean buildings performance standard for large buildings across the state by increasing flexibility and compliance pathways.
