

# **Invest in Climate Action**

In the November 2024 general election, 62% of voters — a clear super majority — upheld the Climate Commitment Act (CCA). The law reduces dangerous climate pollution, supports communities most impacted by climate change, and invests in clean air, public health, job creation, and transportation. As the state faces a large funding shortfall, the Environmental Priorities Coalition's Invest in Climate Action priority seeks to uphold the people's will: using climate funds for their intended purpose.

At a high level, smart CCA budgeting requires:

- Maintaining Base Environmental Funding: Natural Resource agencies make up about 1.6% of General Fund-State spending and between 17%-22% of overall general obligation bond capacity. Staying within these margins is important to long-term reliability for environmental spending.
- Using CCA Funds For Climate Change Solutions: The CCA's purposes are to reduce dangerous climate pollution, prioritize frontline communities for investments, and improve resilience to climate impacts. The funding items outlined below reflect extensive research on the best return on investments to accomplish these purposes.
- **Balancing CCA Funding Across All Accounts**: The CCA allocates funding for clean transportation projects first before providing funding to accounts for clean energy, natural climate solutions, and air quality in frontline communities. Transportation investments were detailed in Move Ahead WA. If additional transfers are made to cover projects under Move Ahead or other transportation expenses, fewer dollars are available for climate solution investments across all sectors and in communities.
- **Prioritizing Frontline Communities**: The CCA budget recommendations from the Environmental Justice Council include specific investments to reduce pollution, address unintended impacts of new investments, and further the goals of the CCA.
